Description

HEXFET transistors also feature all of the well-established advantages of MOSFETs, such as voltage control, very fast switching, and electrical parameter temperature stability. They are well-suited for applications such as switching power supplies, motor controls, inverters, choppers, audio amplifiers, high energy pulse circuits, and virtually any application where high reliability is required. The HEXFET transistor's totally isolated package eliminates the need for additional isolating material between the device and the heat sink. This improves thermal efficiency and reduces drain capacitance.




Fig 1. Typical Output Characteristics




Fig 2. Typical Output Characteristics




Fig 3. Typical Transfer Characteristics




Fig 4. Normalized On-Resistance Vs. Temperature




Fig 5. Typical Capacitance Vs. Drain-to-Source Voltage




Fig 6. Typical Gate Charge Vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage




Fig 7. Typical Source-Drain Diode Forward Voltage




Fig 8. Maximum Safe Operating Area




Fig 9. Maximum Drain Current Vs. Case Temperature




Fig 10. Maximum Avalanche Energy Vs. Drain Current




Fig 11. Maximum Effective Transient Thermal Impedance, Junction-to-Case




Fig 12a. Unclamped Inductive Test Circuit




Fig 12b. Unclamped Inductive Waveforms




Fig 13a. Basic Gate Charge Waveform




Fig 13b. Gate Charge Test Circuit




Fig 14a. Switching Time Test Circuit





Fig 14b. Switching Time Waveforms
